Lesson Topic Copy and Paste

In this lesson the learners will copy part of a drawing into a new drawing.

Outcomes

- Complete a drawing in Paint®
- Select part of a drawing
- Copy part of a drawing
- Create a new drawing
- Paste a copied drawing
- Move a selection
- Resize a selection

Materials Needed

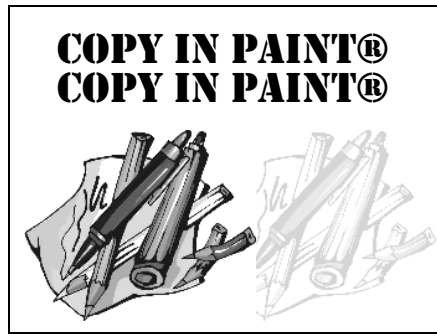
- CD with presentation: Copy in Paint
- Copy of worksheet for each learner

Lesson

Content		Method
1	Introduction	Talk about the advantages of computers. You can save your documents and open it later. You can change (edit) documents.
2	Presentation	Use the presentation to explain how to select part of a drawing, copy it to a new drawing and use it in the new drawing.
3	Practice	The learners work on the computers and practice to copy from a drawing to a new drawing.
4	Worksheet	The learners complete the worksheet.
5	Group work	Each learner thinks of an animal. Draw the picture of the animal on the computer and save. Divide into groups of four. They “build” a new animal out of the drawings of each member.

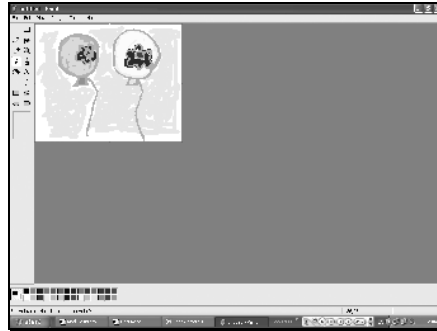
Assessment/ Assignment

Slide 1



If you have a drawing on the computer and you want to use a part of it in another drawing, you do not have to redo it; you can just copy it!

This is your drawing in Paint®.

Slide 3



Choose the Selection tool by clicking it.

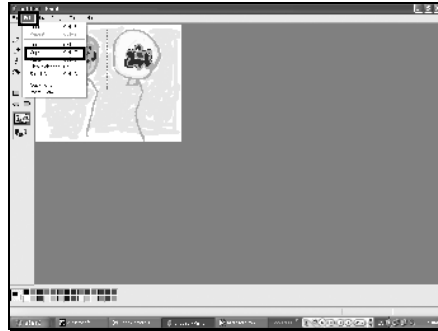
Draw around the part that you want to select.

Slide 5



You will know the part is selected when a dotted line with 8 resizing handles appear around the drawing.

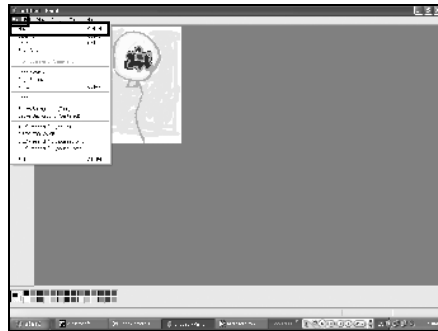
While the part is selected, click Edit. Click Copy on the drop down menu.

The selection is now on the clipboard. Remember you cannot see it, because it is in the computer's memory.

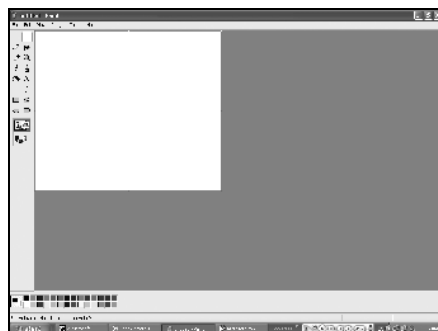
Create now a new drawing. Click File and select New from the drop-down menu.

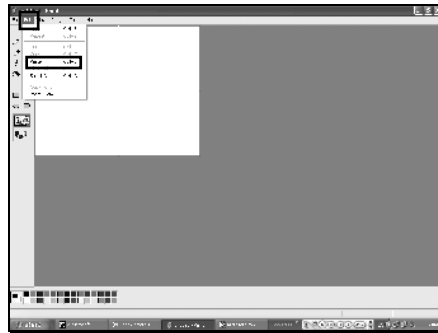
Save the drawing as you always do.

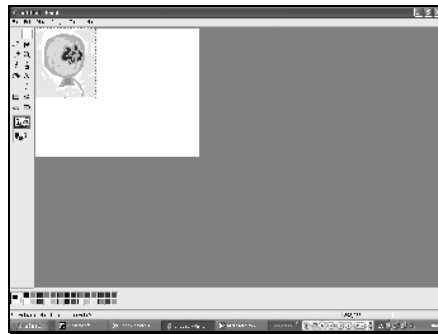
A new canvas is created.

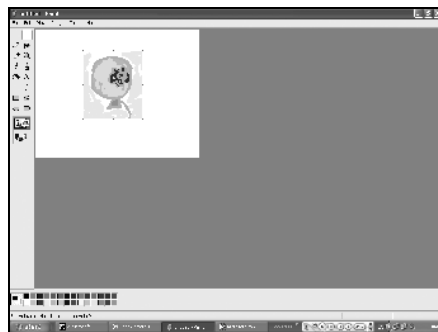
Point to Edit and click Paste.

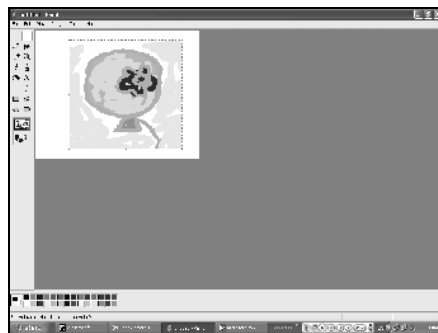
The selected part of the drawing is pasted into the new canvas.

Slide 13



You can see the drawing is still selected, because of the dotted line around it. While it is still selected, you can move it. Click on the selection and move the mouse.

If it still selected, you can also resize it. You can resize it by dragging one of the corners with the mouse.

You can now change the drawing, as you would do with any drawing.

- Save the drawing.

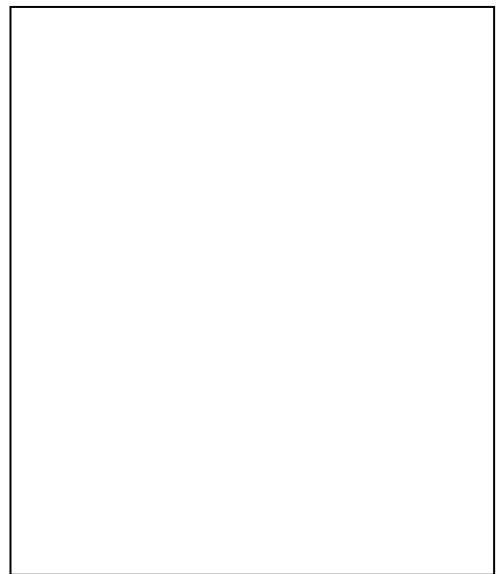

- Copy the legs of the four person's animal and paste it into the drawing.
- You may move or resize the selection.
- You may add lines or colour to make the connection between the different pictures better.
- Save and print the drawing.
